About Dr. S.R. Ranganathan

Dr. Siyali Ramamrita Ranganathan (12th August 1892 – 27th September 1972) was a mathematician and renowned library information scientist in our country. He is recognized and remembered as the 'Father of Library Science in India' and widely known throughout the rest of the world for his work in the field of library and information science. His most notable contributions to the field were his five laws of library science and the development of the first major analytico-synthetic classification system and the colon classification. In his honour, India celebrates S.R.R.'s birthday as the 'National Librarians' Day'.
